After several years of hard work by your Board of Directors and other volunteers, together with support from the Supervisors of Fall Lake and Stony River Townships , Lake County Commissioners, and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, the Kawishiwi Watershed Protection Project (KWPP) is well underway. This extensive and far-reaching study will provide historical as well as current conditions of our watershed, setting guidelines for maintaining our beautiful surroundings well into the future.

Grants of almost a half million dollars have been secured, a significant portion of which require matching funds, either in dollars or in-kind services. Our member volunteers have provided \$32,000 of in-kind services just through August of this year. Together with \$12,800 in cash donations we have made significant headway toward meeting our required match. **MORE is NEEDED!** (But you already figured that out, didn't you?) Two more years of the project, and more volunteer hours as well as money will be needed.

Everything costs more, and we're no exception! We're raising dues, but only by five bucks! Twenty five dollars per year is a bargain to help protect our investment and the pure joy of being here.
